Home/ A Place to Live

- housing assistance, homeless services, home repairs, low income housing

Daily Living

- child care resources, clothing, food, transportation, household goods

Recovery/ Supports

- treatment for drugs, alcohol, and other addictions

Education/Vocational

- employment, job training, early childhood services, home schooling resources, bilingual services, grade improvement services for youth, college support, etc.

Psychological/Emotional

- services for mental health, counseling for family, couples, marriage, youth, behavior, anxiety, depression, etc.

Health/Medical

- free/reduced clinics, prescription assistance, dental care, health care, pregnancy testing, hearing/vision exams, etc.

Safety/ Crisis

- child abuse prevention, child safety, domestic violence resources, car seat safety, short-term emergency childcare, etc.

Legal

- assistance fighting barriers to services needed, free lawyer services, advocacy for people who have mental health challenges, etc.

Family/Relationships

- supportive services, teen parenting, in-home support, parenting, family programs, etc.

Social/ Recreational

- youth services, low cost-memberships, after school programs, sports programs

Financial

- financial assistance, utility and rent assistance, money management, medical bill & equipment assistance, etc.

Advocacy / Resources

- assistance in advocating for youth and family, educational advocacy, childcare assistance, support groups, crisis supports, educational resources, etc.

Community Support

- resources you will find in your community; autism resources, mentoring, crisis supports, respite, family advocacy, life encouragement, etc.

Faith-Based Resources

- Church in your County that sometimes have the resource you need
